'Enchanted Breath' is a curatorial project with 12 contemporary artists from India for 'Art for Oxygen', an initiative by Kankali Trust that has been raising funds for socially relevant causes, which have been directly or indirectly affected by Covid 19.



Nalini Malaviya is a Bangalore based art consultant, curator and writer. She curates contemporary art exhibitions, working with visual artists from across the country and offers curatorial and advisory services to individuals and corporate, providing end to end solutions for art procurement and acquisition.

During the recent second wave of the pandemic, the situation across the country acquired a critical status, and which continues to have massive repercussions. Loss of lives has left families broken and shattered, grieving and struggling with emotional and psychological scars, extensive financial constraints and has left countless children without any form of support. This effort aims to raise funds through sale of artworks, where 50% of the proceeds will contribute towards causes impacted by the pandemic.










